A visit may begin with a specific issue, such as a leak, damaged awning, failed appliance, or body damage, but it can also reveal smaller problems that are easier to address before a trip. This kind of maintenance is especially relevant in an area where many RV owners travel across desert highways, mountain routes, and regional campgrounds with changing road and weather conditions.

For owners whose vehicles are parked at a home, campground, or storage facility, on-site service can reduce the need to move a large vehicle for certain repairs.
